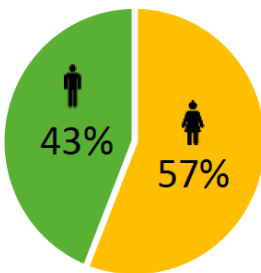

Inuit Qaujisarnirmut Pilirijjutit (IQP)

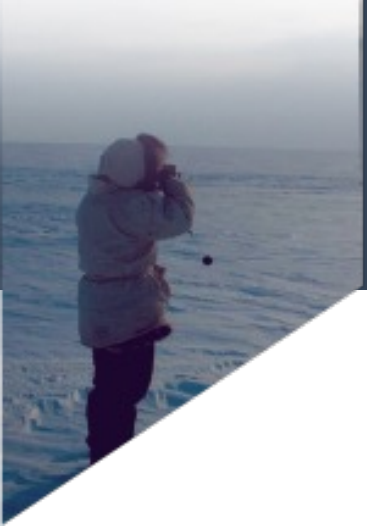
5 Priority Areas of National Inuit Strategy on Research



- The first **Inuit-led, directed and governed research program** in the world
- Led by the four regional Inuit Land Claims Organizations, the IQP is Inuktut for “***Inuit Research Program***”



- Implements Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami (ITK)'s National Inuit Strategy on Research (**NISR**)

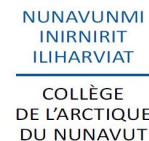

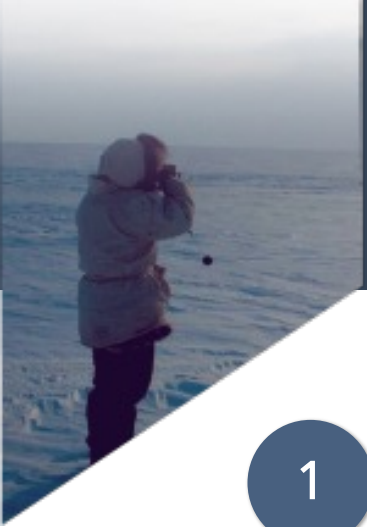
