Beluga Working Group



Beluga Working Group

1. New beluga management plan set.
 2. Focus on strategies and support systems to harvest in areas that have plenty of beluga.
 3. Hunting Camp at Long Island:
 - a) Consultations with the Cree to set up a traditional hunting camp
 - b) Work with regional organizations to strategize how best to support hunters providing for their communities.
 - c) Two additional camps, a freezer and also a renewable energy system
 - d) Hunts from August to October of each year, with about 20 - 30 hunters
- Need to work together, and now, on strategies for wildlife management at the local and regional level, without so much focus on restrictions and limitations.
